Not only do gutters prevent unsightly stains to the exterior of your home, but the variety of styles and colors can elevate your home's appearance.



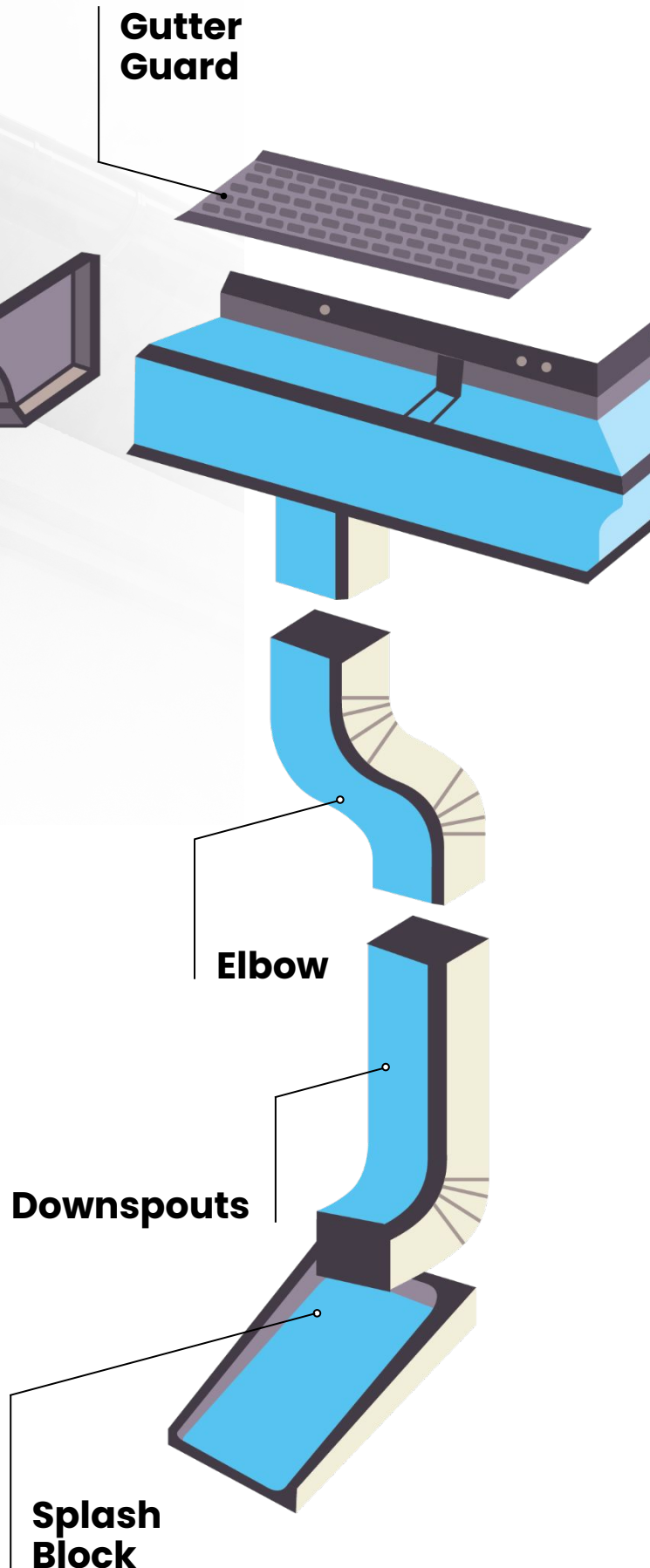
Reduces Pest Infestation

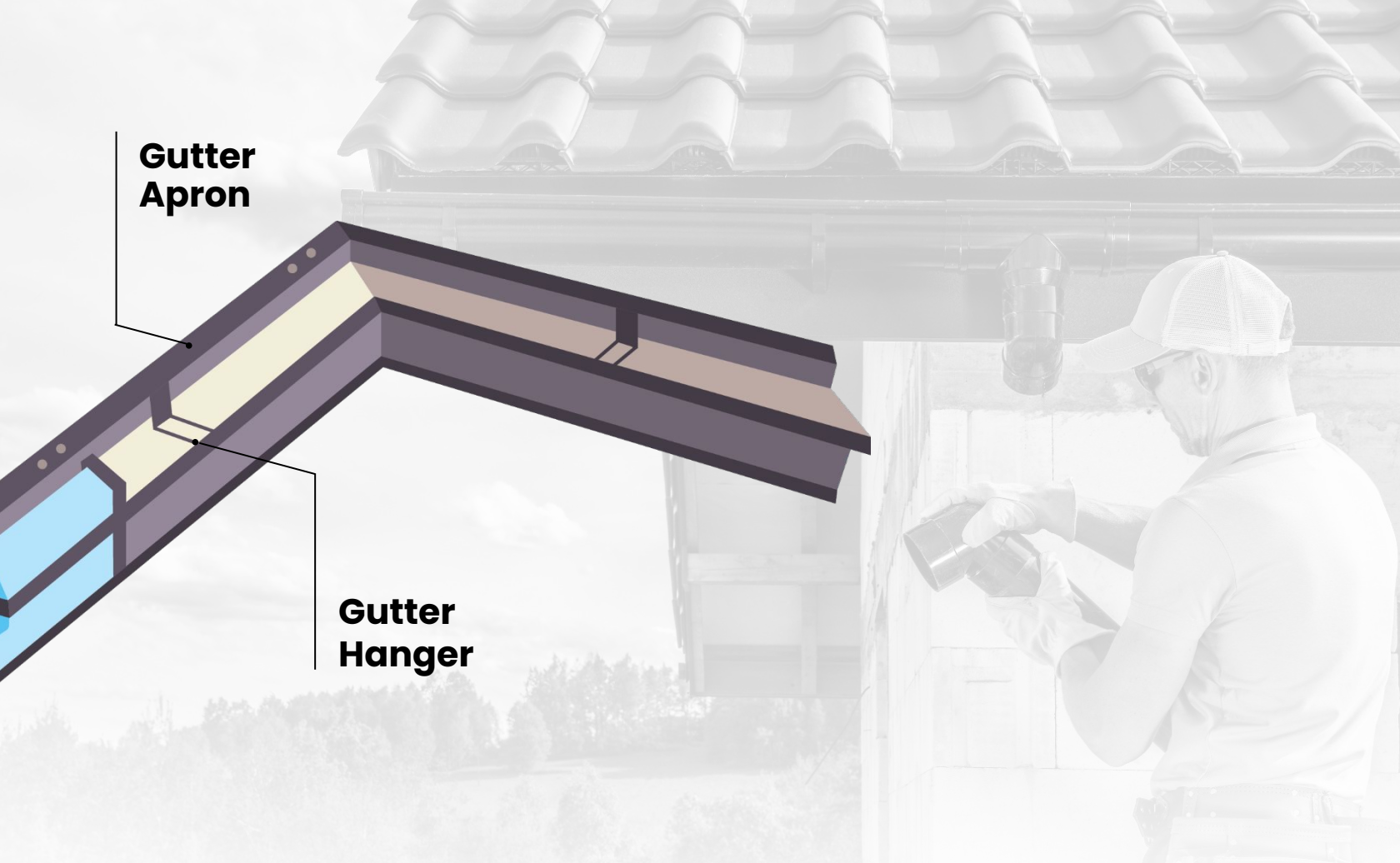
Gutters keep stagnant water from collecting, which attracts pests like mosquitoes, rodents, and insects that can damage your home (and peace of mind!)

Parts of a Gutter System

Understanding Your Gutter System

A gutter system has several essential components working together to protect your home. An experienced contractor will be able to recommend the best system to fit your property's needs. Below are the main components we will use to protect your property.





Gutters

Horizontal channels that collect and direct rainwater.



Downspouts

Vertical pipes that carry water to the ground.



End Caps

Seal the open ends of the gutters to prevent leaks



Gutter Apron

A metal flashing installed under the roof shingles that directs water into the gutter.



Gutter Hanger

Secure gutters to the house.



Splash Blocks

Guide water from the downspout and safely away from your foundation.



Gutter/Leaf Guards

If your home is under tree coverage, this is a vital upgrade to prevent debris buildup and clogged gutters.



Elbow

A curved section of the downspout that changes the direction of water flow.

Signs of Damage



Pooling Water

This indicates your gutters aren't directing water away effectively from your home's foundation.



Crack or Holes

Visible cracks, splits, or holes in the gutters can lead to leaks and inefficiency.



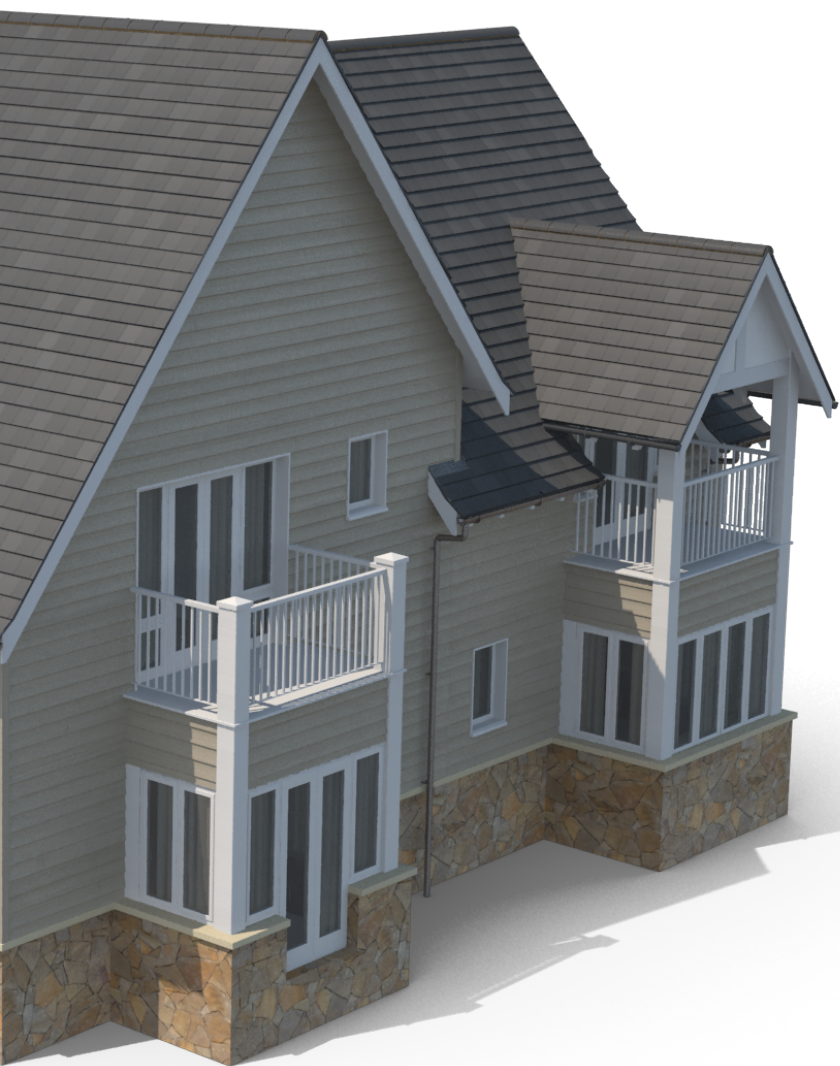
Sagging or Pulling Away

Gutters should sit flush against your roofline, if you notice gaps that indicate water is escaping the gutter system.



Is It Time to Replace or Repair Your Gutters?

If you notice any of these visible signs of gutter failure, contact us for a full inspection. There may be more extensive damage to your full roofing system that needs to be addressed. After the inspection, we will be able to determine if you'll need a repair or upgraded system.



Peeling Paint or Rust Spots

These can signal long-term water exposure or age.



Overflow During Rainstorms

Often caused by clogs or improper slope of the gutter system.



Rotting Fascia or Soffits

A sign water is seeping behind your gutters! These rotting areas need to be replaced as well as the gutters before the water can penetrate more layers (and cause more costly damage!)

How Gutter Replacement Works



1 Inspection

We evaluate your current system with our gutter inspection checklist. We will assess the efficiency of the gutter system, check for failures, and document our findings with photos and notes.



2 Estimate

We will provide you with multiple options on how to move forward, whether it's a repair, replacement, or just a recommendation for regular maintenance. This estimate will include your inspection report, recommended upgrades, and timelines for the project.



4 Removal

We will safely remove your old gutters without damaging your home. If you have additional repairs needed to your property, we will outline them for our team to complete or recommend a professional to assist.



3 Design

When it's time for a replacement, we get to work on the fun part together-- design! Time to choose the right type of gutters (materials, colors, and styles) that match your home's needs.



5 Installation

The installation timeline depends on the scope of the project. We will secure new gutters and attach downspouts taking proper care to not disturb your landscaping or roofing system.



6 Final Check

After installation is complete, we will test the system to ensure proper flow and efficiency of all the components.

Choosing the Right Gutter System for Your Home

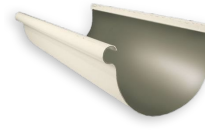
Styles

Half-Round Gutters

Style common for traditional homes with their classic look.

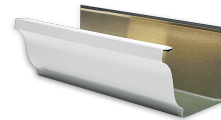
Advantages: Timeless, Available in more materials.

Made from plastic. Cost-effective and lightweight but not recommended for all homes and climates.



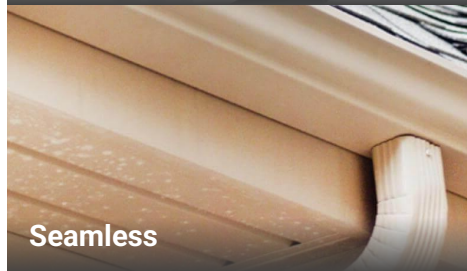
Aluminum Gutters

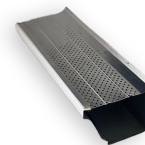
Seamed



Seamless

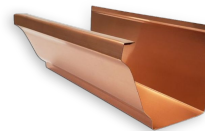
Seamless Gutters

Leaf Guards

Blocks debris, reducing gutter cleaning and maintenance.

Some homeowners upgrade to copper gutters for their durability, aesthetic appeal, and long-lasting performance.

Frequently Asked Questions



How much will my gutter system cost?

The cost of your gutter system depends on the size and needs of your property. Gutters are an important investment because they protect your home's foundation, which can be one of the most costly repairs to your property if it fails. We will work together on building a system that works for your home and budget.



How often should I clean my gutters?

It's recommended to clean your gutters at least twice a year – once in the spring and again in the fall. This prevents clogs caused by leaves, twigs, and other debris, ensuring proper water flow.

Tip: If you have overhanging trees, you may need to clean them more frequently or consider installing leaf guards.



How long do gutters last?

The lifetime of your gutter systems depends on a few factors. The material you choose, the climate you are in, and the amount of maintenance you complete on the system can vary the lifespan.



Do I need leaf guards?

If you have tree coverage around your home you may be prone to frequent clogs without leaf guards. Adding them to your system can save time, save money, and reduce maintenance in the long term.



What is the best material for gutters?

Metal gutter systems are the most durable. A strong system means less replacements and repair costs in the long term.



Are seamless gutters better than regular gutters?

Yes, seamless gutters are generally better for most homes because they:

- Reduce the risk of leaks (no seams to weaken over time).
- Provide a cleaner, more polished appearance.
- Require less maintenance.
- Are custom-fitted to your home.



Can I install gutters myself?

While DIY gutter installation is possible, professional installation is recommended. Proper installation ensures the right slope for water flow, secure attachment, and long-term durability. Poorly installed gutters can lead to water damage or the need for costly repairs.



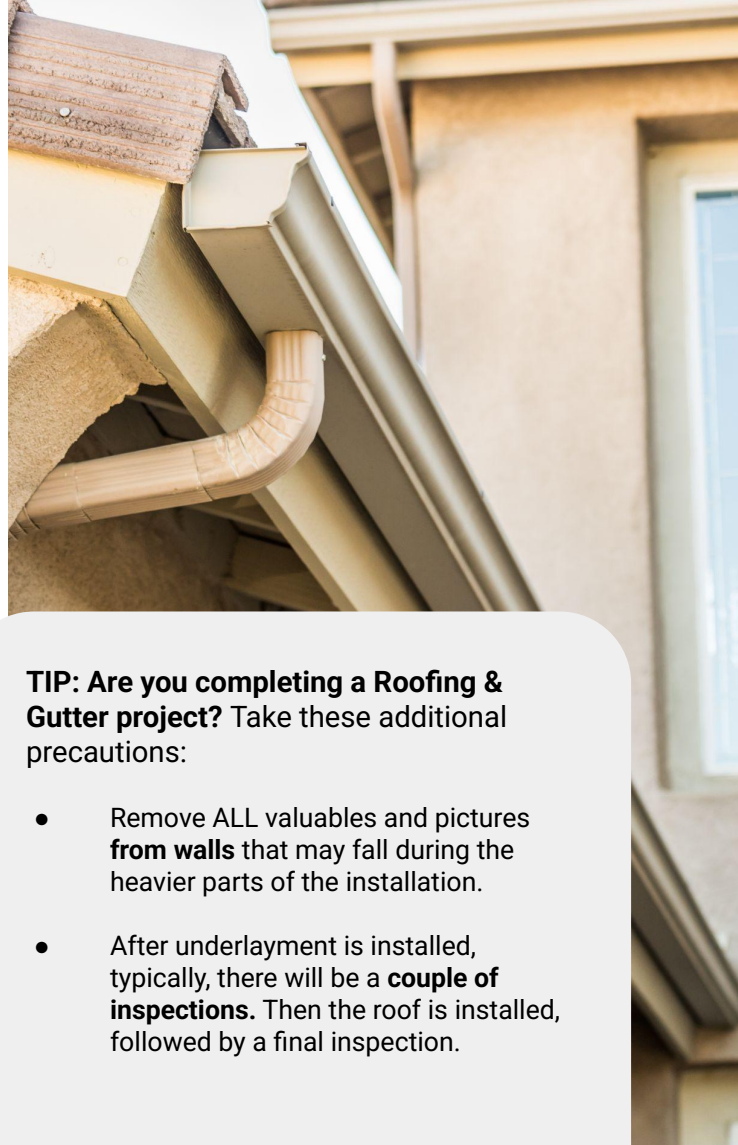
Does my gutter system come with a warranty?

Depending on the gutters you choose, you can include a warranty on your system. We have different levels of protection available for you to choose from.

Preparing for Gutter Replacement

Our team will **always** take extra measures to protect your property during install. To ensure an easy installation process we recommend doing the following:

- **Clear the area** around your home, removing any outdoor furniture or decorations.
- If possible, **mow the lawn** a few days before we arrive.
- Make the contractor aware of any **additional protection** needed for landscaping, pathways, decks, etc.
- **Park cars away from work areas** as an extra precaution.
- If you have any pets, please keep them **indoors or somewhere safe** for the days that we are working.
- Expect installation to take a few hours to a full day. If you are planning to be home, **expect some noise** during the workday.



TIP: Are you completing a Roofing & Gutter project? Take these additional precautions:

- Remove ALL valuables and pictures **from walls** that may fall during the heavier parts of the installation.
- After underlayment is installed, typically, there will be a **couple of inspections**. Then the roof is installed, followed by a final inspection.

Maintenance Tips for Your Gutters



Inspect for damage after storms

If you are in an area prone to severe storms, your insurance company may cover the replacement of your gutter system (and roof system!) if it has been damaged. Contact us to perform an inspection to determine if that is necessary.



Schedule professional inspections annually

We recommend annual exterior inspections on your property. A small issue caught early can lead to thousands of dollars in savings in the long term.



Clean Gutters twice a year

We recommend a cleaning in the spring and fall, especially if you have tree coverage around your property.

Tips:

- Trim trees around your gutters to prevent blockages.
- Clear your gutters and downspouts by running water through them.
- Check drainage after heavy rainfall.
